OpenInterface workshop

Call for participation



Welcome to the OpenInterface workshop that is organized by OpenInterface (OI) STREP project (FP6-035182) and will be held on Wednesday, July 16, 2008, during the DSV-IS 2008 conference in Kingston, Ontario, Canada.

OI STREP project (<u>www.oi-project.org</u>) is a research project, financed by the European Union that aims to design, implement and test an **open source software framework** for developing **multimodal interaction**. As part of DSV-IS 2008, we organize a **dinner session** for playing and testing our open source framework. We are very keen to receive your comments on the framework.

OpenInterface framework?

Multimodal interaction is challenging to develop especially in mobile/ubiquitous settings with novel interaction devices. Addressing this challenge, the OpenInterface framework is made of an underlying platform, namely OpenInterface platform, and the OpenInterface Interaction Development Environment (OIDE). The OpenInterface Interaction Development Environment tools for assembling, combining and testing modalities at multiple levels of abstraction (from the raw data to the semantic of users' events). Using the OIDE Graphical Editor, components accessible via the repository can be inspected, configured, linked to other components and to external services or to application functionality. The result can be either an individual technique or a fully functional user interface to a real application. The OIDE is built on top of a runtime kernel that enables the communication between heterogeneous components.

A dinner session for whom?

Aimed at multimodal application engineers, designers, and computer scientists working in humancomputer interaction or anyone who is interested in the domain and wants to discover, learn and efficiently use the framework for designing, implementing and testing multimodal interaction. The idea of the open-source OpenInterface framework targets efficient cooperation of users from both industry and academia, so participants from both fields are welcome!

How to benefit most from the workshop?

We will show and explain how OpenInterface components can be integrated and reused. We will present common case studies for everybody to illustrate the capabilities and functionalities of the framework. However,

(1) if you have interaction modalities you would like to study (for example: "I would like to test how to efficiently use head-tracking (webcam) and voice to enhance interaction for navigating in a map"), please contact us in order to add your modalities in the framework,

(2) if you have a particular application you would like to study from the point of view of multimodal interaction, send us applications / case studies that you are currently working on or would like to develop, so that you can work on your own case studies instead of the common one we will propose. You will have a chance to play with the applications through the OpenInterface Interaction Development Environment (OIDE): modifying modalities, adding new modalities, combining modalities, fine tuning or monitoring modalities in a graphical and efficient way.

You can benefit from participating as a test user just as much as by being actively involved!
